

PARKING

Free parking is available in the Dogwood lot directly in front of the Ogle Center and in the Hickory lot directly behind the Ogle Center from one hour prior to the curtain time until one hour following the conclusion of the performance. Vehicles parked in other locations and/or at other times may be subject to ticketing.

THE OGLE CENTER AT IU SOUTHEAST

The Ogle Center is located on the campus of Indiana University Southeast in New Albany, Indiana, nestled in the foothills of Floyds Knobs. IU Southeast is just minutes from downtown Louisville, Kentucky. The city of New Albany, the southern Indiana area, and the Greater Louisville community offer a wide range of restaurants, hotels, attractions, historical points of interest, and shopping experiences.

Ticket Office: The ticket office is located in the lobby of the Ogle Center. The ticket office opens 90 minutes prior to curtain time on show dates.

Seating Policy: The front doors to the building open approximately 90 minutes before curtain time and the doors to the performance hall open approximately one-half hour before curtain time.

Late Seating: As a courtesy to performers and audience members, latecomers will not be seated until a suitable pause in the performance. Due to contractual agreements, latecomers will be seated only at the discretion of the management.

Children: All patrons of the Ogle Center, regardless of age, must have a ticket for admission. This includes infants and children.

Smoking: Indiana University Southeast is a tobacco-free campus. Smoking is prohibited in the Ogle Center and its theaters.

Photos and Video Recording: Unless expressly allowed by the artist, the taking of photos and/or the recording of video is prohibited. In the event that photography is allowed by the artist, an announcement will be made from the stage prior to the start of the performance. Flash photography is prohibited at all times.

Rest Rooms: Restroom facilities are located across the lobby, passed the Barr Art Gallery and passed the stairwell that divides Knobview Hall and the Ogle Center.
